MEETING DESCRIPTION

Statement of Need

Physicians and cardiac care associates are required to maintain up-to-date knowledge of the latest clinical developments in the practice of cardiology to improve patient outcomes. The Ohio Chapter-ACC Annual Meeting will include education that provides needs-based learning covering a thorough overview of pregnant women and heart disease, LVADS, surgery and non-surgical options, quality indicators, arrhythmias and pulmonary hypertension.

Overall Goal

Increase aptitude about quality indicators and improve competence of proficiency in clinical decision-making to bring about quality patient care.

Learner Objectives:

Upon completion of this program, participants should be able to:

- Decrease maternal and fetal mortality and morbidity in pregnant women with pre-existing heart disease by improving diagnosis, management and appropriate counseling.
- Reduce complications of non-cardiac surgery by reviewing evidence-based guidelines.
- Discuss ways to provide patients with heart failure with appropriate referrals for LVADS.
- Analyze how to provide patients with pulmonary hypertension with appropriate diagnosis and optimal management.
- Improve morbidity and mortality by appropriate use of cardiac robotic surgery.
- Recognize and differentiate between benign vs. malignant forms of ventricular arrhythmias and to understand when non-ICD therapy is appropriate and even preferred in the treatment of ventricular tachycardia in order to improve outcomes and prevent sudden death.
