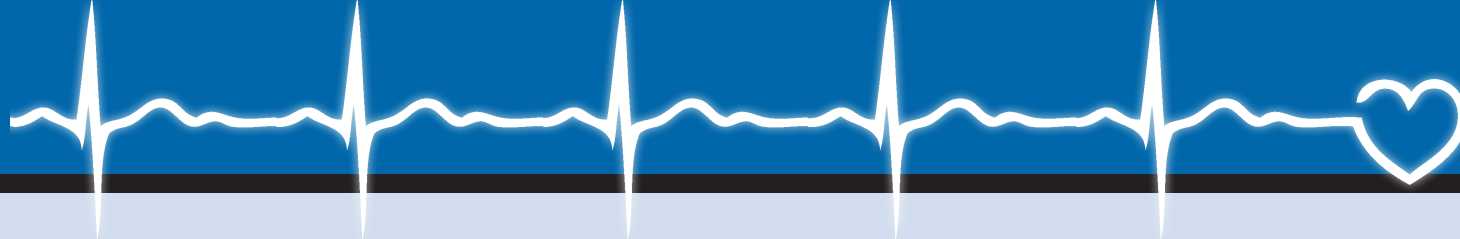

MEETING DESCRIPTION



STATEMENT OF NEED

Physicians and cardiac care associates are required to maintain up-to-date knowledge of the latest clinical developments in the practice of cardiology to improve patient outcomes. The Ohio Chapter-ACC Annual Meeting will include education that provides needs-based learning covering a thorough overview of atrial fibrillation, sleep disordered breathing and heart failure, health care reform, percutaneous valves, cardiac risk assessment and nuclear cardiology.

OVERALL GOAL

The overall goal of this activity is to bring about quality patient care by increasing aptitude about quality indicators and improving competence of proficiency in clinical decision-making.

LEARNER OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this program, participants should be able to:

- Discuss the indications for anticoagulation in atrial fibrillation and know the newer medications used to do this.
- Review the signs and symptoms of obstructive sleep apnea and the reasons why this disease can contribute to cardiovascular morbidity and mortality.
- Describe the ACC position on health care reform and the reasons why such reforms are essential.
- Analyze the indications and limitations of percutaneous valve replacement procedures.
- Examine the literature, including the JUPITER trial, on the use of statin therapy in low risk patients.
- Discuss the indications and limitations of PET scanning in patients with coronary artery disease.
- Differentiate between the new and old versions of the ACC and STS data collection forms.
